The lesson will start with the director of human resources at my externship location coming to speak at a freshman career explorations class. He is a great connection that I made at ANTHC, and he feels strongly about connecting with high school students and encouraging them. He also feels strongly about promoting healthcare professions to youth. He has a great deal of experience within human resources in a hospital setting, and he knows what to communicate to students in order to help them decide if healthcare is a field worth exploring. He will help them to understand what skills a strong candidate possesses, and he will advise students on how to develop those skills.

After listening to the guest speaker share about different health career opportunities, students will research different health careers to create a career fair flyer. The flyer will contain skills needed within the health care field. It will also contain a minimum of 10 different careers within healthcare, what the people do within the job, and required degrees.

Students will utilize Microsoft Publisher to create their job announcements.
